

Salt Lake City, Utah 5-Day Educational Trip Curriculum

Day 1: History and Settlement

Morning:

- Arrival and check-in at the hotel.
- Orientation session with the mentor: Overview of Salt Lake City, its historical significance, and geographic features.
- Visit to the Utah State Capitol for a guided tour and discussion on state governance and local history.

Afternoon:
